Recent major donations to the Institute of Archaeology

Most UK universities now regard fund raising as an integral part of their academic strategy. Major initiatives in research and training are increasingly funded by donations from charitable organizations, companies and individuals. In recent years the Institute has had two principal fundraising objectives: first, to create new laboratories and a secure artefact store in the basement, and secondly, to raise a substantial sum to support training in archaeological conservation. Both initiatives were successful, thanks first and foremost to substantial "core" grants from, respectively, the Wolfson Foundation and the Getty Grant Program of California. The former led to the opening, in 1991, of the Wolfson Archaeological Science Laboratories (see p. 5), and the latter to the doubling, by 1995, of the Getty Grant.
